Michaela completed her coursework as a wife and mother while working full time as a teacher for a Head Start program in Omaha.

I was able to get full support from my center being able to leave for TEACH time and study or get my homework done. I was able to complete all my coursework in a faster time than I imagined by pushing myself and having full support that I can do it from TEACH. Loss of Funding for Child Care WAGE\$® Nebraska

Have you heard of Child Care WAGE\$®?

Child Care WAGE\$® is a program that provides education-based salary supplements to low-paid early care and education providers working with children, ages birth to five, in licensed child care settings. This program is designed to increase retention, education, and compensation of the early childhood workforce. TEACH and WAGE\$ go hand-in-hand! TEACH is a means to support individuals, such as yourself, as they work their way up the WAGE\$ scale and increase their education. Participants in both programs can receive TEACH bonuses and WAGE\$ incentives simultaneously!

However, due to loss of funding, we will no longer be able to offer this opportunity in our state. When we did receive funding, we were only able to offer this opportunity to family child care providers. However, the ultimate goal was to be able to offer it to anyone working in early childhood. Since we awarded our first supplement in 2020, we having been trying to get additional funding from other sources, such as our state legislature, but nothing has come to fruition.
